Notice From Ian Coverdale:

I am delighted to announce a successful ministerial stationing round this year.

Rev Cathy Bird has been invited to come to the new Stockport United Circuit as circuit superintendent and has accepted. She will have the pastoral care of the Hazel Grove, Dialstone Lane and Windlehurst churches. We look forward to her joining us from 1st September next year and she looks forward to working with us.

Cathy is an experienced minister with two dozen years as a Methodist minister, until now all in London circuits, and has been a circuit superintendent for the last ten years. This a letter from Christian Aid , please read . Dear Friends.

This Christmas, Christian Aid's 'Be a peacemaker' appeal invites individuals, churches and community groups to stand with the people on the frontline of peace-making. In our materials, we showcase partners who are protecting vulnerable communities, reducing violence and restoring fragile people who have had traumatic experiences of conflict. They're 'creating pockets of peace that bring hope to seemingly hopeless situations'.

Christian Aid's advocacy work tackling violence and building peace complements7j this appeal by (in part) challenging the UK Government's role in peacebuilding across the world. On 10th December we will launch a report outlining Christian Aid's policy positions and will challenge the UK Government's defense strategy (eg stop selling arms), call for greater diplomacy and a focus on development (eg through greater and more effective spending on peacebuilding).

This report will be supported by a campaign to the Foreign Secretary calling on them to be a peacemaker, in the first instance, by suspending UK arms sales to Saudi Arabia immediately and working with all parties to cease hostilities in in Yemen. The report and campaign will be launched by our Chair, Dr. Rowan Williams at a prominent London location linked to peace (possibly by the Cenotaph.)

We will be sending giant Christmas cards (depicting the peace dove)to the Foreign Secretary with the wording below. We need you to help us to get these signed by members of your congregations and other people in your network during advent. Once the card has been signed, we will take a picture of it with a congregation/church leader or small group along with the number of people who have signed them, and any messages from church leadership. We will then turn these photos, numbers and quotes into a photobook that Rowan Williams will send to the Foreign Secretary by 20th December. We won't be sending the cards themselves to government because we wasted a lot of time trying to convince Government offices to receive our giant cards in 2016 (and in the end they didn't take them.)

Dear Foreign Secretary

Christmas time has never been more dangerous for the people of Yemen, with half the population on the brink of famine due to the fighting. Yet the UK is selling arms to the Saudi-led coalition carrying out indiscriminate attacks on civilians.

We call on you to be a peacemaker.

Please suspend UK arms sales to Saudi Arabia immediately and work with all parties to cease hostilities and allow humanitarian access to those most in need. Please will you also review the UK's spending on peacebuilding.
