The church is working towards to becoming an Eco Church. This involves trying to be as eco friendly as we can, not just

the products we use but in worship as well.

You will notice that the toilet tissue will change over the next couple of weeks.

We are now using toilet rolls supplied by a company called "Who Gives a Crap?"

They are made from recycled paper and wrapped in paper so no plastic is used .

Also 50% of their profits are then given to the

Toilet Twinning program .

So they obviously do care as do we !!!

The hand soap and washing liquid is also being replaced with Eco Cover which is more environmental friendly and existing bottles will be refilled from a larger bottle so cutting down on the amount of plastic bottles we are using.

Blaggs Hardware store offer this service if you want to help too, just take along a bottle and they will refill it with, hand soap, washing up liquid or laundry liquid.

Old Testament Reading Exodus 17:1-7

From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the LORD commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. The people quarreled with Moses, and said, "Give us water to drink." Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?" But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?" So Moses cried out to the LORD, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me." The LORD said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink." Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled and tested the LORD, saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?"
