
Our coffee morning on 4<sup>th</sup> October, from 10:30 until 12:00 is to raise much needed funds for Lebone Village.

#### **Draw a Red Line for Gaza**

Red Line for Gaza is a movement bringing together voices from across the UK to demand an end to the killing and suffering in Gaza.

As we watch horror unfold, the Israeli government and military's actions cross red line after red line.

## You can join Christian Aid in making a red line at your church to show that enough is enough.

On 24 and 25 September, we'll be outside the Welsh and UK parliaments with people of different faith traditions to join in prayer and make a red line that our governments can't ignore.

We'll express our solidarity with our neighbours in Gaza and demand action.

We will be exploring how we can show our support over the coming week but in the interim you may wish to write to our MP – a template letter is available on the Christian Aid website using the link above.
