

**LIVING LOUNGE** - Thank you to all the volunteers who ran lunch at the living lounge on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> September whilst I was on annual leave.

A reminder that lunch is open to everyone from both church and community. There is no charge although you may choose to give a donation. The main purpose of the lunch is to help alleviate food waste, but through the provision of the lunch we have heard first hand how it has helped with peoples feeling of loneliness, social isolation and some low-level mental health concerns.

Some of the food we collect is also made into food parcels and is delivered to people in need in the wider community, these are people, mainly families who are known to JoAnne our community worker. If you know someone who is struggling and unable to collect food for themselves you are welcome to take food or speak with JoAnne.

You may have experienced a lunch where there were few options - and although you may have been disappointed it is actually a success because it means the supermarket had minimum food waste which is ultimately what we want!

As we move into the Autumn months we will be looking at supplementing the lunches with hot soup. The space will also be open earlier from 11:00 and remain open until 15:00, as well as the provision of table activities such as games, cards and colouring sheets.

This is a space for all of us so any suggestions on improvement would be greatly appreciated!

Christian Aid Week May 2026 – the team have already begun thinking about how we can support Christian Aid week in 2026 and are looking at the possibility of a plant sale. If this is something you are able to assist with please speak with either JoAnne, Katy Rowe or Jean James!



All are welcome to join us for our September Messy Church session where we will be exploring text from Jeremiah 29:1-14 through the lens of hope and a personal relationship with God.

#### What are we currently collecting?

We always take donations of **home items, clothes, handbags and bedding**. We are regularly asked for items from people we are working with directly or from agencies/organisations across Stockport. Items are donated across the wider community, including the homeless, those fleeing domestic violence, refugees etc.

Early Essentials Manchester have been working with health and social care professionals and other agencies for 10 years, with a goal to give a helping hand to new mums who are in desperate need of even the most basic supplies.

We collect various items for baby including newborn and 0-3 month clothing, nappies, nappy cream, muslin squares, dribble bibs etc. We also collect items for Mum including maternity pads, toiletries (new and unopened) chocolate biscuits, breast pads, wash bag and more. A full list is available outside the office

Items for use with our children and young people; egg boxes, toilet rolls and glass jars (ideally with the label cleaned off)

**Clean and empty crisp packets** these are turned into "blankets" and will be part of a bigger project in the winter. Please note we no longer accept donations of bread bags and other soft plastics there are alternative recycling areas for these at local supermarkets.



**Bras**, used, new or surplus bras which help raise vital funds for research into secondary breast cancer. See bra bank in the vestibule at church.

**Knitted Projects** for a project in early October we are collecting knitted square blankets of various sizes/colours/patterns. Wool and size details are on the blessings table and all blankets need to be with the Community Worker JoAnne by 30<sup>th</sup> September.



Additionally we are looking for a large number of knitted/crocheted miniature pumpkins for our Community Harvest Meal as per the picture about 9cm in diameter. A pattern will be available outside the office or can be emailed! Please speak with Community Worker JoAnne
