This week Katy Rowe shares this poem, a heartbreakingly beautiful testimony, written by Doctor Ezzideen in Gaza – it's heartbreaking but we share it to remind us all why we all need to keep on being a voice for justice for the Palestinians.

There is no internet.

No signal. No sound. No world beyond this cage.

I walked thirty minutes through ruins and dust. Not in search of escape, but for a fragment of signal, just enough to whisper, "We are still alive."

Not because anyone is listening, but because to die unheard is the final death. Gaza is silent now.

Not with peace, but with obliteration.

Not a silence of stillness, but of smothering.

They severed the last cable.

No messages leave. No images enter.

Even grief has been forbidden.

I passed the corpses of buildings, of homes, of men, some breathing, some not.

All of them erased by the same hand that erased our voices.

This is not a siege of bombs alone.

It is a siege of memory: a war against our ability to say, "We were here."

The bombing never stopped, especially in Jabaliya

It won't let me post the whole thing

Tell them to read Deuteronomy 28

They shell the streets where children beg for food.

They shell the lines where mothers wait for flour.

They shell hunger itself. No food. No water. No exit.

And those who try, those who reach for aid, are struck down.

People die here, and no one knows.

Not because the killing paused, but because the killing of connection succeeded.

The internet was our final breath.

It was not a luxury; it was the last evidence of our humanity.

Now it is gone.

And in the dark, they massacre without consequence.

I found this faint eSIM signal as a dying man finds a flicker of flame.

I stood beneath a broken sky, risking death, not for rescue, but to send this.

A single message. A last resistance.

If you are reading this, remember: we walked through fire to say it.

We were not silent. We were silenced.

And when the cables are restored,

the truth will bleed through the wires,

and the world will know what it chose not to see.

If you would like to join the Bible Study leading team or have a say in when the next sessions are, what we should study next or simply want to know more please join us your input is greatly appreciated and welcomed.

The Worship Group are pleased to share the outcome of the Worship survey with everyone.

Thank you to everyone who completed a survey. 45 surveys were received with the majority of the responses given by the older and most frequent attenders in our congregation. The majority are 'Somewhat' or 'Very satisfied' with the worship as it is offered at present. Most people like a mixture of traditional and contemporary styles of worship. Several people commented that they appreciated the variety of preachers.

As a result of the survey the Worship Group are taking the following actions: <u>Hearing & Seeing</u>: microphones will be checked each Sunday and the speaker in the Coffee Lounge will be switched on. A large print copy of the readings will be provided for the reader. Also, a request has been sent to the Preachers' meeting that training in voice projection and articulation be considered, and PowerPoint presentations comply with Circuit Policy re font size and background colour.

<u>Other styles of worship</u>: Anne will rerun the sessions on 'Searching for God in the West End' in the Autumn, at a date, time and place to be arranged. JoAnne will explore the possibility of a Taizé service one Sunday evening in the late Autumn. A Love Feast will take place at a later date. Other suggestions will be considered.

<u>Children and Family Worship</u>: Trying to work out how we cater for modern families appropriately in 2025 is an ongoing challenge. We need to make sure that they are made to feel welcome in every situation. We are grateful to JoAnne and Graham that we are able to offer specific family worship at times other than 10.45 on Sundays. However, we must strive to include those who choose to attend at that time. We will ask the Circuit to designate the first Sunday of the month as All-Age Worship and have small tables at the back of church each week with items to engage children during the service. We intend compiling a rota of volunteer adults willing to sit at the tables to welcome and encourage the children. The Coffee Lounge will continue to be available to be used as a Crèche with toys available for small children.

A further Worship Survey is proposed to target families in particular.

<u>Activities and Interaction</u> – The survey revealed that some members prefer a style of worship which allows for more interaction than our usual pattern provides. We will encourage preachers to include some kind of optional interaction where possible. However, we are aware that neither all preachers nor all members of the congregation would feel comfortable with this on a regular weekly basis.
