This meeting is for anyone interested in fundraising, in addition to those who are responsible for a charity.


Please bring any fundraising ideas you may have along with you to be shared at the meeting.

MOOR LOVE

We will be sending just over £400 to Stockport Without Abuse from our Moor Love events.

After events like this the question “How did it go?” is always asked and it can be easy to answer this question with how many people attended or how much was raised.

However, when I review events the question I ask is “What was I trying to achieve?” and Moor Love’s aims were:

- ♥ Encouraging random acts of kindness
- ♥ Exploring what it means to be “pre-loved” by God
- ♥ Connecting with the wider community
- ♥ Supporting Stockport Without Abuse
- ♥ Building volunteer engagement

As you read my reflection of Moor Love I hope you will agree these aims were met successfully!

Pre-Loved Events - A Reflection

Over the weekend of the 13th February, we held two *Pre-Loved* events as part of our wider campaign encouraging random acts of kindness and reflecting on what it means to be pre-loved by God, while also raising funds for Stockport Without Abuse.

The two events looked very different, and both showed us something important.

Our Pre-Loved Clothes Sale was small in attendance, with one person coming along, but that person had travelled from Heald Green to be with us. We were able to have meaningful conversation and offer genuine welcome. Our volunteers also had time to connect and even enjoy a little well-earned care themselves!

The Pre-Loved Table Top Sale saw 33 people attend, 27 of whom were from the wider community rather than church. It was wonderful to welcome so many new faces and to have good conversations, including some thoughtful reflections on what it means to be “pre-loved” by God.

Across both events:

- 11 volunteers gave their time and energy
- 5 families shared random acts of kindness they had carried out
- We saw encouraging engagement with our Pre-Loved posts on social media
- Funds were raised to support Stockport Without Abuse, over £400

Success doesn't always look the same. Sometimes it's breadth, lots of people through the door. Sometimes it's depth, one person feeling seen and valued. We're thankful for both.

Thank you to everyone who volunteered, donated, came along, shared kindness, or supported the events in any way.

PRE-LOVED BY GOD

Pre-loved by God, what feelings, memories, or thoughts does this phrase awaken in you?

Our final reflection on what it means to be Pre-Loved by God is from Rev Katie Smith.

PRE-LOVED.a reflection by Rev. Katie Smith

One of my very favourite bits of liturgy comes during the baptism service when the person being baptised is told:

*for you Jesus Christ came into the world;
for you he lived and showed God's love;
for you he suffered death on the Cross;
for you he triumphed over death,
rising to newness of life;
for you he prays at God's right hand:
all this for you, before you could know anything of it.
In your Baptism,
the word of Scripture is fulfilled:
'We love, because God first loved us.'*

For me, this sums up what it means to be pre-loved by God – God has been at work loving us for our whole lives and even before. We cannot earn or lose God's love, because God's very nature is love.

When we hear these words said over a small child, we can't help but agree: it seems obvious that a baby is to be loved simply because they are. Perhaps though we become a little less sure when we think about ourselves with all our mistakes and faults, perhaps we are not loveable any more?

When Jesus met the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4:1-26) she found out that Jesus knew all about her life and the things that made her ashamed and led her to avoid the other women of the village. Jesus knew that she had had five husbands and was living with a man who wasn't her husband. This foreknowledge was not simply a mind-reading exercise to show God's power. Rather it showed her that Jesus's offer of living water was for her was love for her just as she was.

Psalm 139 sums up God's knowledge of us. God knitted us together in our mother's wombs, perceives our thoughts from afar and knows our words before they are even on our tongue.

Whatever highs and lows our lives have had, those baptismal words still hold – Jesus came into the world, lived died and rose again for each one of us. Next time you are at a baptism, listen out for those words and know that they are for you and every person in the place as much as for the one being baptised.

We are pre-loved, we are loved now and we will be loved forevermore.




FAIR TRADE COFFEE MORNING
